Nominations are invited for UCU-UWE Branch Executive Officers and Faculty Representatives for the period June 2025 - May 2026. Nominations can be sent to the Returning Officer Christine.Taylor@uwe.ac.uk

Please forward in the body of an email to the Returning Officer: your name and UWE email address; the role for which you are standing; and the names and email addresses of two other members who are willing to propose and second your nomination. Nominations and seconds do not need to be sent in a single email; they can be sent separately. Nominations can also be accepted from someone without a UWE email account if accompanied by the member's UCU membership number.

Under branch rules, when only one person is nominated for a post then that person is automatically elected; where two or more people are nominated to the same post, an electronic election will be held. Alternatively, an arrangement can be made to share the role. If any posts are not filled at the time of the AGM then a person may be elected at the AGM following usual branch meeting rule

All posts listed below are open to nomination. Training will be an entitlement and will usually entail at least 6 days in the first year. You are entitled to take this time off from your normal duties. You do not have to negotiate your own facility time or training time with your Head of Department. Human Resources will inform your line manager in due course.

Executive Committee Meetings currently take place once a month (term-time) on Wednesday mornings 10.00 to 12.00 and attendance is a minimum obligation.

One person may take on a representative role in addition to an officer role and sharing of roles (particularly reps) is possible.
